PhD STUDENTS - ENGG 800

Friendly reminder, if you are a MASc or PhD student you must take ENGG 900 as part of your program. If you have taken 6 credit hours of research or more you are eligible to take ENGG 900. It is recommend that you take it 50% of the way through your research. This is a 0 credit hour class so it must be taken with other credit hours. Do not leave this until the very end as you cannot graduate without it. This class is only offered in Fall and Winter terms (Spring Summer 2024 is one exception but this will not happen again), so please plan accordingly.

SAFETY NEWS

 If you have an incident/accident or "near-miss" on campus or during fieldwork, it must be reported within 24 hours. This is for everyone, not just lab users! Reporting helps ensure you are OK and helps us prevent future incidents. The intent is never to place blame. <u>Reporting an Incident on Campus | Health and Safety, University of Regina</u> (uregina.ca)

- For all chemical labs, safety glasses are required <u>at all times</u>. If you wear prescription glasses, the "over-the-glasses" or OTG style of safety glasses is needed. See UR Stores RIC for options. Also remember appropriate clothing no shorts, skirts or sandals. Wear long pants and shoes that fully cover the feet.
- When ordering chemicals, there is an approval process that helps ensure we have safety protocols in place. This is for your safety and ours, and helps ensure we meet

legal requirements for transportation, storage and handling. NEVER order hazardous materials yourself online! Submit all purchase requisition forms to Kathy.Varcoe@uregina.ca.

- If you are acquiring samples that are potentially hazardous (either collecting them yourself off campus or getting them shipped to the UofR) – please follow the chemical purchasing process above. Submit a requisition form to Kathy well in advance of sample collection/shipping. Just like chemical purchasing, we need to ensure safe and legal transportation, storage, and handling.
- Do not store chemicals/hazardous materials in fume hoods, as this violates the National Fire Code. For your protection, keep fume hoods uncluttered and sashes down as far as possible. Never pour hazardous materials down the drains.
- Hand hygiene is extremely important in labs for your health and well-being. Wash your hands often with soap and water, especially when leaving the lab. Do not use your cell phone or other personal items with dirty gloves (it happens a lot!) If your lab needs hand soap or paper towels, the faculty will pay for it. Annual Fob/Access Card Renewals

Access cards and fobs expire each year on June 15 – and we have some great news! A new online system will be available shortly (early the week of June 3). You'll be able to request your renewal online within the Engineering Safety Orientation on UR Courses. Just upload any relevant safety training certificates, input the location(s) you need to renew and your supervisor's name, and then submit. It will automatically go to your supervisor for approval, and then to the Faculty Safety Coordinator (Lauren). Once it has final approval, you'll receive an email notification with further instructions and safety reminders. It's a much simpler and much faster process – and you can check the status of your request online at any time. Keep in mind that it's a new system and please have patience with us. If you encounter any problems, you can notify Lauren.Bradshaw@uregina.ca. If you just received new office/lab access from May 1

<u>Lauren.Bradsnaw@uregina.ca</u>. If you just received new office/lab access from May onward, there is no need to renew. Your access is already valid until June 2025.
