REGISTRATION WAITLISTS (WL)

Is the class full? Get on the waitlist! Waitlists are a first-come-first-served basis. If the class has a lab/seminar you can only be waitlisted for the lecture. Waitlist Instructions

When an open seat becomes available, an e-mail will be sent to your preferred E-mail Address. Check your preferred e-mail address on a regular basis if you are on a WL. I'd recommend every morning and every night.

If a section is full and the section has a waitlist set up in Banner, the students can put themselves on the waitlist. When a registered student drops and one seat becomes available, the student at the first position in the waitlist is sent an email notice that they can register for the class. For the Spring/Summer term, the notice is valid for 24 hours. For the Fall and Winter terms, the notice is valid for 24 hours until the first day of classes at 9:00 a.m. On the first day of classes, this is changed to 12 hours. For the Fall term (202530), the change will occur on September 2, 2025 at 9:00 a.m. For the Winter term (202610), the change will occur on January 6, 2026 at 9:00 a.m. In this process, if the time frame is missed by the student in the first position, the student who is next on the waitlist is given the opportunity.

For the Spring/Summer term, there are 7 standard Parts of Term (POTs), namely, 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, and 7. Waitlists are deleted at 9 a.m. on the third day of classes. If the third day falls on a weekend or stat holiday, the waitlist deletion occurs at 9 a.m. on the following business day. Active waitlist notifications will also expire when the waitlists are deleted.

Waitlists for a non-standard POT will be deleted on one of the four dates listed below. More specifically, the deletion date is one of the four dates, which is before the first day of classes for that POT. For example, classes in a POT that starts on May 22, will have the waitlists deleted on May 7. Classes starting prior to the first day of POT 1 will not be assigned a waitlist except for POT 10.

For Spring/Summer 2025, waitlists will be deleted at 9 a.m. based on the following schedule:

Registration HOLDS....you don't want one! Check it out BEFORE it's time to register!

Registration <u>holds</u> will prevent you from registering in a waitlisted class. Holds will prevent you from registration in *any* class. So, check your holds before registration. You can view your holds in your UR Self-Service account under the 'Prepare for Registration' tab.

<u>12 Month Internship</u>

The Engineering Co-operative Internship Program is set to begin a new intake of students, with placements commencing in September 2025 for 12 months. We will be accepting applications from **March 3rd through March 21st**, 2025. Applications for Fall 2025 Internship must be made by completing the application form in <u>Career Connect</u>. Afterwards, a co-op coordinator from the Co-op office will reach out to book an entrance meeting with you.

Eligibility: Completion of Terms 1-7 classes (enrollment in Term 6 – SS 2026), minimum 72 credit hours, maximum 102 credit hours completed, Term and PGPA no less than 60%.

Please note - if you are an International Student and do not have a Co-op Work Permit, you will need to apply for it before February 14, 2025. Please email the co-op office (<u>coop.office@uregina.ca</u>) to request a letter of support for your application.

With hopes to inspire future Canadian leaders with a foundation of expertise and experience in China, this program will provide grants for Canadians to pursue post-secondary studies, research, short-term professional development opportunities, and/or language training at leading institutions across China.

Expenses covered by this program:

- Medical insurance
- Round-trip airfare (conditions apply)
- On-campus accommodation (or a subsidy for off-campus accommodation)

Eligibility:

Any Canadian citizen who is an enrolled student, faculty member, researcher, or mid-career professional is eligible and encouraged to apply.

WHMIS Reminder

The "Undergrad Mandatory WHMIS" course is required for all beginning undergraduate Engineering students (including re-admissions and transfers). It's a crucial part of our Engineering accreditation (considered the absolute bare minimum for safety training) and your own professional development – but most importantly, it will help ensure your safety in future engineering courses. Our WHMIS course is also required for access to the Student Shop.

To ensure WHMIS is completed, we recently put a registration hold on your account. You'll need to complete our WHMIS course before registering for your next semester(s).

What is required of you?

- Complete Undergrad Mandatory WHMIS on UR Courses (passing grade 80% 3 attempts are permitted). Do this well in advance of your next registration time ticket!
- Download your certificate. As soon as you download, we'll automatically receive notification and we will then remove the registration hold (within 2 business days). If you don't download, we won't know that you have finished.

Note we require completion of Engineering's WHMIS certificate – we cannot accept certificates from other faculties or employers.
