Important Dates:

Spring classes (POT 040) – May 6-June 19. Drop day is May 9 (with no record on account)

Academic Action:

Academic action is assessed at the end of every term. Emails/Letters will be distributed to students once final grades are in. Please refer to the information below to familiarize yourself with academic action at the U of R.

Probation: A student is placed on probation if their UGPA has slipped below 60% and the student has 24 credit hours (8 courses) to raise to a 60%. If you have been placed on probation, you will receive an email to your preferred email address.

Continued Probation: A student is placed on continued probation if their UGPA has not been raised to a 60% and courses continue to be counted toward the 24-credit hour maximum before MW (Must

Withdraw). If you have been placed on continued probation you will receive an email to your preferred email address.

MW (Must Withdraw): If a student fails to raise their UGPA to 60% within 24 credit hours of going on probation they will be MW. This is a 12-month absence from campus. The ARP program may be taken. Courses taken at another institution during this time will not count for transfer credit. If you have received a MW you will receive an email to your preferred email address AND a letter to your mailing address.

RTD (Require to Discontinue): If a student fails a course 2 times and has a UGPA below 60% they will be RTD from the Faculty. This is an 8-month withdrawal from Engineering. The student can transfer to another Faculty or to the Academic Recovery Program. Courses taken during the RTD period at another institution will not be accepted as transfer credit. If you have received a RTD you will receive an email to your preferred email address AND a letter to your mailing address.

If a student 2 time fails a course and their UGPA is 60% or above they will not be RTD.

If a student fails a course for the 3rd time, they will be RTD regardless of UGPA. If a student fails English for a 3rd time, it is an automatic 2 year MW.

If a student is MW for a second time it is an automatic 2-year absence from campus.

Note: A student will not be accepted back into Engineering from a RTD or an MW without a 60% UGPA. If a student has been RTD or MW more than once (or a combination of the two) their UGPA must be 65% to be readmitted to Engineering.

Major Declaration

Don't forget to declare your major!

You must have completed **OR ARE IN THE PROCESS OF COMPLETING** 8 of the 10 first-year classes including ENGG 100, ENGG 123, ENGG 140 and ENGL 100.

Application Deadlines: Dec 1st, Apr 1st, and Aug 1st....We will take them anytime!

Eligibility:

- Students admitted to first year with a major of ENGG apply for allocation to the major of their choice with a minimum of 8 required courses in Year 1.
- Students who have transferred from another University of Regina faculty or have been admitted from another post-secondary institution must have completed one full-time semester within the Faculty of Engineering and Applied Science. Allocation will be based upon PGPA.

- All current engineering students who are already in a major, other than ENGG, and wish to request a change in major may submit an application form. Allocation will be based upon PGPA and space in the desired program.
