World Aids Day – 1 December 2024

<u>World AIDS Day</u> is one of the most important days for commemorating health. The 2024 theme, Take the Rights Path, reminds us that we can end AIDS if everyone's rights are protected. With a surge in attacks on the rights of affected people and communities, many of the progress and victories made are being lost. Acceptance, respect, and care are essential in destigmatizing individuals and communities affected by HIV/AIDS. Laws that punish, discriminate, or stigmatize create barriers to accessing healthcare.



International Day for Abolition of Slavery – 2 December 2024

Modern slavery transcends ethnic, cultural, and religious lines. In 2021, it was estimated that 50 million individuals worldwide lived in slavery. Modern slavery includes, but is not limited to, forced labor, debt bondage, and human trafficking. Victims are often unable to leave due to threats, violence, and coercion. It is reported that one in eight individuals in forced labor are children, and more than half of them are in commercial sexual exploitation. Cyber slavery is another growing form of modern slavery, where individuals are coerced into online scamming activities and physically abused if they do not comply.

National Day of Remembrance and Action on Violence against Women - 6 December 2024



The murder of 14 young women at Polytechnique Montréal on December 6, 1989, led Parliament to designate this day as the <u>National Day of Remembrance and Action on</u> <u>Violence Against Women</u>.

As we remember those who have experienced genderbased violence and those we have lost to it, we are also reminded that we must act.

Ending the cycle of violence requires educating ourselves and speaking up.

Pansexual Pride Day – 8 December 2024

Pansexuality has allowed the GSRD community and others to challenge how we think about gender, sexuality, and romance.
