Afrotribes Summer Camp Impact Statement





The 2024 Afro Tribes Summer Camp was an extraordinary journey of youth engagement, cultural continuity, and social health, spanning six vibrant weeks from July 8th to August 16th. Growing from 35 participants last year to an inspiring 85 this year, the camp became a powerful hub of connection and learning, leaving a lasting impact on all involved. Language and storytelling celebrated their heritage, while dance and drama performances allowed their talents to shine. Debates and canvas art projects ignited critical thinking and self-expression, empowering the youth to find their voice.
