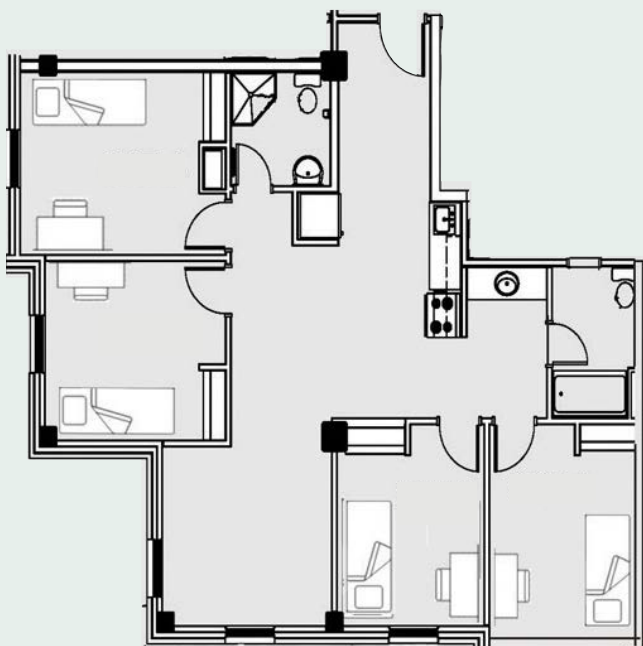
THE STUDENT VILLAGE AT LUTHER COLLEGE

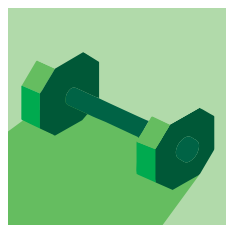

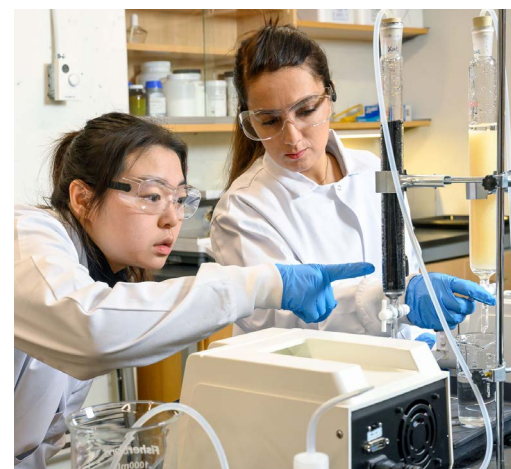

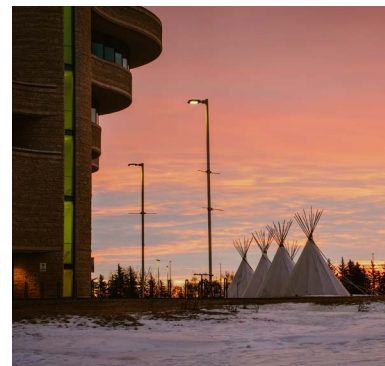

GOVERNMENT STUDENT ASSISTANCE

You'll have access to two forms of financial aid from both the provincial and federal governments — loans and grants. If you apply for student loans, you'll be required to start to repay them once you're no longer a full-time student. Grants, in most cases, do not need to be repaid. When applying for government assistance, make sure to apply in your home province — even if you are moving to Saskatchewan to study.



Government student assistance is intended to help you pay for your education. The amount of assistance available will depend on your personal and family situation and can only be determined after you have submitted a student loan application.
