#### 5.1 Chancellor's Report

Chancellor Klein provided a verbal update to Senate, including:

- In November, attended the Saskatchewan Government Insurance (SGI) donation announcement. SGI donated \$1.5 million over 10 years to support undergraduate programming in data science
- Also in November, hosted "A Taste of Research: The Chancellor's Community Lecture," focusing on health and wellness
- Later this month, a "Theatre of Dreams: A Chancellor's Community Dinner and Tour" will be held focusing on the Faculty of Media, Art, and Performance
- Various Senate Committee meetings were held including, the Joint Committee of Senate and Council on Ceremonies, Senate Committee on Affiliation and Federation, and Senate Appeals Committee
- The 15<sup>th</sup> Annual Inspiring Leadership Forum is sold out, but online tickets are still available. All are encouraged to attend
