NEW DATASETS IN THE RDC

CANADIAN FOOD ENVIRONMENT DATABASE 2018 New Survey

The Canadian Food Environment Dataset (Can-FED) is a geographic-based set of measures that represents the food environment of Canadian communities. The primary envisioned use of the Can-FED is research and analysis of the relationship between the local food environment, dietary intake and health outcomes.

CANADIAN COMMUNITY HEALTH SURVEY - ANNUAL COMPONENT 2020

The central objective of the **Canadian Community Health Survey** (<u>CCHS</u>) is to gather health-related data at the sub-provincial levels of geography (health region or combined health regions).

CANADIAN COMMUNITY HEALTH SURVEY 2020- HEALTHY LIVING

The **rapid response on healthy living** collected information from respondents on their sleep patterns, quality, and habits, such as questions on sleep and wake times and use of electronics before sleep.

CANADIAN HOUSING STATISTICS ROGRAM 2018, 2019, 2020 New Survey

The Canadian Housing Statistics Program (<u>CHSP</u>) is an innovative data project that leverages existing data sources and transforms them into new and timely indicators on Canadian housing. The database was developed by combining data from multiple sources (e.g., property assessment rolls, land titles, Census of Population, etc.) and provides detailed information at the property and owner levels.

CANADIAN SOCIAL SURVEY—COVID-19 AND WELL-BEING 2021 New Survey

The Canadian Social Survey (CSS) will collect information on a variety of social topics such as health, well-being, impacts of COVID-19, activities, time-use, and emergency preparedness. The goal is to understand social issues more rapidly by conducting surveys on different topics every three months.

PORTRAIT OF CANADIAN SOCIETY: PERCEPTIONS OF LIFE DURING THE PANDEMIC 2021

The purpose of the **Portrait of Canadian Society: Perceptions of Life During the Pandemic (<u>PCS-PLP</u>)** survey is to explore Canadians' perceptions of various facets of life including home and work life, leisure and well-being.

SURVEY ON SEXUAL MISCONDUCT AT WORK 2020

The purpose of the **Survey on Sexual Misconduct at Work** (**SSMW**) is to obtain an accurate picture of the nature, extent, and impact of: inappropriate sexual behaviours; discriminatory behaviours based on sex, sexual orientation, and gender identity; and sexual victimization within Canadian work-related settings.

CANADIAN HEALTH SURVEY ON SENIORS 2019 New Survey

The Canadian Health Survey on Seniors (CHSS) is a supplement to the Canadian Community Health Survey (CCHS) - Annual Component. It collects information related to health status, health care services, supports, as well as social and health determinants for the Canadian population aged 65 and over.
