NEW DATASETS IN THE RDC

CANADIAN CANCER REGISTRY (CCR) - INTERNATIONAL AGENCY FOR RESEARCH ON CANCER (IARC) 2021

The Canadian Cancer Registry (CCR) is a population based registry that includes data collected and reported to Statistics Canada by each provincial/territorial cancer registry.

CANADIAN CANCER REGISTRY (CCR) -SURVEILLANCE EPIDEMIOLOGY AND END RESULTS (SEER) 2021

The Canadian Cancer Registry (<u>CCR</u>) is a population based registry that includes data collected and reported to Statistics Canada by each provincial/territorial cancer registry.

CANADIAN CENSUS HEALTH AND ENVIRONMENT COHORT 2021

The Canadian Census Health and Environment

Cohort (CanCHEC) is the latest in a series of population-based microdata linkages. The cohort consists of 8,660,377 persons selected from the 2021 Census of Population long-form sample with mortality follow-up through December 31, 2022 using the Canadian Vital Statistics – Death database. The linked data can be used to examine mortality by demographic, social and economic characteristics such as age, sex at birth and gender; education; geographic areas, housing; immigration and ethnocultural diversity; income, etc.

CANADIAN HEALTH SURVEY ON CHILDREN AND YOUTH 2023

The Canadian Health Survey on Children and Youth (CHSCY) explores issues that have an impact on the physical and mental health of children and youth, such as physical activity, the use of electronic devices, time spent in school and extracurricular activities, mental health, childhood experiences, suicidal thoughts, substance use and impact of the COVID-19 pandemic.

NEW DATASETS IN THE RDC

CANADIAN HOUSING SURVEY 2022

The **Canadian Housing Survey** (<u>CHS</u>) collects information about housing needs and experiences from a sample of Canadian households. Information is collected on core housing need, dwelling and neighbourhood satisfaction, housing moves, and other aspects of well-being related to housing.

CANADIAN INCOME SURVEY 2022

The **Canadian Income Survey** (CIS) is a cross-sectional survey developed to provide a portrait of the income and income sources of Canadians, with their individual and household characteristics.

INDIGENOUS PEOPLES SURVEY 2022

The **Indigenous Peoples Survey** (<u>IPS</u>) provides data on the social and economic conditions of First Nations people living off reserve, Métis and Inuit, aged one year and older, in Canada.

INDUSTRIAL PRODUCT PRICE INDEX New!

The **Industrial Product Price Index** (**IPPI**) measures price changes for major commodities sold by manufacturers operating in Canada.

ISOLATED POSTS ALLOWANCE INDEXES New!

The **Isolated Posts Allowance Indexes** (<u>IPAI</u>) collects data used to calculate spatial price indexes that determine the Living Cost Differential allowance level payable, under the Isolated Posts and Government Housing Directive (IPGHD), to Canadian government employees serving at "isolated" locations in Canada.

MEDICAL ASSISTANCE IN DYING 2022

The **Medical Assistance in Dying** (MAID) is based on reports from physicians and nurse practitioners on written requests for and provisions of Medical Assistance in Dying (MAID) across Canada for the 2019, 2020 and 2021 calendar years.

UNIFORM CRIME REPORTING SURVEY 2022

The **Uniform Crime Reporting Survey** (<u>UCR</u>) was designed to measure the incidence of crime in Canadian society and its characteristics. Information collected by the survey includes the number of criminal incidents, the clearance status of those incidents and persons-charged information.
